INTRODUCTION

- Kurdish diaspora as a important player for Kurds in the Homeland (Alinia, 2004; D'Angelo, 2008; Eliassi, 2010; Wahlbeck, 1999)
- purpose of this study:
 - exploring the role of Kurdish community organizations in preserving identity and political activism among the Kurdish diaspora in Japan and UK.

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THE CONCEPT OF DIASPORA, POLITICS & IDENTITY

- key differences between the two terms:
 - Nation
- nations must be self-aware.
- A nation believe its right to territorial control

- Ethnic Group
- Ethnic groups may lack self-awareness.
- A territorial referent is not a necessary feature of ethnic groups

THE CONCEPT OF DIASPORA, POLITICS & IDENTITY

• Diaspora:

dispersed people with a 'common origin in a smaller geographic area. (Ember et al., 2005).

Characteristics:

- 1. dispersion,
- 2. homeland
- 3. boundary maintenance.

THE CONCEPT OF DIASPORA, POLITICS & IDENTITY

 diaspora and identity are very related concept in social science

• Five core elements of "Identity"

(Brubaker & Cooper,
2000, p. 6)




- Identities as non-instrumental forms of social action;
- Identities as a collective phenomenon of group sameness;
- Identities as deep and foundational forms of selfhood;
- Identities as interactive, procession, contingent products of social action;
- Identities as changing, unstable and fragmented modes of the self










Figures:1991 exodus during which time more than one million civilians were displaced by Saddam Hussein's regime.







FINDINGS

An exercise in ethnic identity awareness

Diler (M: 38): I learned more about the lives of the people in my home country here. The sentimental gap between those who come from the home country and who are born here closes in these organizations. This is a place where we can share differences. Everyone shares their culture here. Everyone breaks their prejudices here.

Apo (M: 27): Those who attend to the Kurdish organizations give up religion later on. I can say that those who attend to these organizations do not pay much heed to religion. Religion is relegated to a secondary status. What is important is the cultural identity. Kurdish identity is of foremost importance here. Religion is not so much. When I arrived here, I was religious too. But later on I learned everything. Right now religion does not mean much to me. I have respect for humans. When I was in my homeland, I was of course a little bit different... The people who come to these organizations think like me.

Alan (M: 30): I am a Kurd. I have been more aware of this especially since I left Turkey. Since people live together there, the distinction between Kurds and Turks is not very important when political views is the same between them. However I connected to my identity more here or to be more precise I realized my identity here. I have foreign friends. When they ask me where I am from, I tell them that I am from Turkey but I am a Kurd.

DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSION

- Kurdish community organizations and Kurdish immigrants in Japan were closely interacting with the Kurds in Japan.
- Kurds consider these organizations to preserve their Kurdishness
- Kurdish diaspora in Japan in NOT a kind of transnational movement
- the political activism of passive people is ensured through the Kurdish based organizations
